Dog Halloween Costume Safety Guidelines

Before dressing up your dog in any Halloween costume keep these guidelines in mind to ensure a fun and safe night for both you and your pet:

1. Avoid any toxic ingredients
2. Beware of choking hazards
3. Keep it simple
4. Never leave your dog unattended
5. Comfort is key
6. Consider a test run
7. Take the temperature into consideration
8. Don't go overboard
9. Keep photo shoots short
10. If your dog looks uncomfortable or if he's in danger, ditch the costume

Remember: if you have any concerns about a potential costume for your canine companion, consult your trainer and/or veterinarian beforehand.



Frozen Pumpkin Dog Treats

Ingredients

- 1 cup [plain yogurt](#) (The yogurt should be plain with no added sweeteners, either natural or artificial. Plain, Greek-style yogurt is better for dogs because it has lots of live cultures and lower levels of lactose.)
- 1 cup pumpkin puree (100% pumpkin, NOT pumpkin pie canned pumpkin)

Directions

1. Mix pumpkin and yogurt together in a bowl
2. Divide the mixture evenly into an ice tray or molds
3. Freeze for 24 hours
4. Pop the treats out of the mold and put into a freezer bag for storage. You can also leave them in the ice tray if you have space in your freezer!
